BEAR MOUNTAIN GOLF AND TENNIS RESORT COMMUNITY GETTING HERE

AIR

Located 30 minutes from downtown Victoria and five minutes from the Town of Sidney, the Victoria International Airport has daily flights from Vancouver International Airport and Seattle-Tacoma Airport, as well as direct flights from points throughout Canada and the US. Regular floatplane and helicopter service to downtown Victoria is available from both Vancouver and Seattle.

SEA

Victoria is well connected to mainland BC and Washington State by vehicle and passenger ferries and a high-speed catamaran. Each day, dozens of ferries cross the straits, offering breathtaking views of the rocky coastline, forested islands, inlets and often marine wildlife sightings. Victoria's arrival points include the Inner Harbour in downtown Victoria, the Town of Sidney and the Swartz Bay Ferry Terminal (30 minutes from downtown Victoria, near Sidney).

LAND

Travel options around Greater Victoria and surrounding areas include taxi and limousine service, airport shuttle and public transportation.

DRIVING TO BEAR MOUNT AIN RESORT FROM THE CITY OF VICTORIA

From the city centre, continue on Douglas Street as it turns into the Island Highway (Highway #1/ Trans-Canada Highway). Stay on the Island Highway for approximately 15-20 minutes until you see Exit 16 (Leigh Road/Bear Mountain Parkway). Take Exit 16 and proceed to the furthest right hand lane and exit right on to Leigh Road. Proceed straight through one last traffic light and follow the Bear Mountain Parkway straight up to the Resort.

DRIVING TO BEAR MOUNTAIN RESORT FROM BC FERRIES TERMINAL IN SIDNEY

After exiting the ferry, stay on Highway 17 for approximately 32 kilometers until you see the McKenzie Avenue exit. Turn right onto McKenzie Avenue and continue straight until reaching the Island Highway (Trans-Canada Highway/Highway #1) where you will make another right hand turn. Continue west on the Island Highway until you see Exit 16 (Leigh Road/Bear Mountain Parkway). Take Exit 16 and proceed to the furthest right hand lane and exit right on to Leigh Road. Proceed straight through one last traffic light and follow the Bear Mountain Parkway straight up to the Resort

DRIVING TO BEAR MOUNTAIN RESORT FROM VICTORIA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

After leaving the airport, you will encounter several traffic circles. Follow the signs and use the exits for Victoria/Highway 17 (Pat Bay Highway). Stay on Highway 17 for approximately 32 kilometres until you see the McKenzie Avenue exit. Turn right onto McKenzie Avenue and continue straight until reaching the Island Highway (Highway #1/Trans-Canada Highway) where you will make another right hand turn. Continue west on the Island Highway until you see Exit 16 (Leigh Road/Bear Mountain Parkway). Take Exit 16 and proceed to the furthest right hand lane and exit right on to Leigh Road. Proceed straight through one last traffic light and follow the Bear Mountain Parkway straight up to the Resort.

DRIVING TO BEAR MOUNTAIN RESORT FROM THE NORTHERN VANCOUVER ISLAND

Following the Island Highway (Highway #1/Trans-Canada) south towards Victoria. Take Exit 16 (Leigh Road/Bear Mountain Parkway exit) and stay in the furthest left hand lane to turn left on to Leigh Road. Continue straight up to Bear Mountain Parkway for 3.5 KM to the Resort.


